

June 2, 2026 Statewide Direct Primary Election Public Service Announcement

Orange County Registrar of Voters is committed to protecting each voter's right to cast a ballot easily and securely

SANTA ANA, Calif. — May 4, 2026 — Voting in the June 2, 2026, Statewide Direct Primary Election has begun.

Ballots are being mailed to all active registered voters in Orange County.

Voters have four options to cast a ballot during this election:

1. Mail the ballot on or before Election Day (no postage required). For mailbox locations, visit ocvote.gov/mail.
2. Use one of 128 secure ballot drop box locations in Orange County. For locations, visit ocvote.gov/dropbox.
3. Drop off the ballot in person at any Vote Center in Orange County.
4. Vote in person at any Vote Center in Orange County.

Starting Saturday, May 23, select Vote Centers will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. From Saturday, May 30 through Monday, June 1, all Vote Centers will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. On Election Day, all Vote Centers will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
