Thank you for registering to vote! You'll find all party ballots have been consolidated into one easy-to-read sample ballot. Detailed instructions have also been included for your reference.

This Sample Ballot contains information for the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election. Please take a moment to be prepared prior to voting.

- **Vote-by-Mail:** You can save time and vote-by-mail. If you are a permanent vote-by-mail voter your ballot will be sent automatically to you. If you are not a permanent vote-by-mail voter you may apply by using the application on the back of this pamphlet or by visiting ocvote.com/votebymail. The last day to request a vote-by-mail ballot is May 27, 2014. Please remember to mail your ballot early to avoid any potential postal delays.
- **Polling Place:** If you choose to vote at your polling place please plan ahead. Parking is limited at some locations and you can avoid congestion by voting mid-day if possible. You will have the option of voting an electronic or paper ballot at the polls. Simply advise the poll worker of your preference when signing the roster.
- **Questions:** California's new Top Two Primary changes the way primary elections are conducted. **Now all voters – regardless of party – can vote in the Primary Election.** You can find details in this pamphlet or by visiting ocvote.com/toptwo. Please use a black or blue ink pen to mark your choices on the ballot. To vote on the content on the measure, completely fill in the box to the left of your choice. To vote for a write-in candidate, completely fill in the box to the left of the space provided for that purpose and attach the name of your choice on the line. If you are a voter at a polling place and wrongly mark, tear or deface any portion of your ballot, contact your poll worker. If you are a voter by mail voter, contact the Registrar of Voters office at 1300-C South Grand Avenue, Santa Ana, CA 92705, (714) 567-7600, to receive another ballot. Voided ballots must be received by the Registrar of Voters office no later than (Date of Election) at 8:00 p.m. Postmarks are not accepted.

VOTER-NOMINATED AND NONPARTISAN OFFICES
All voters, regardless of party preference may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, provided they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. Voter-Nominated Offices. The party preference, if any, of a candidate for a voter-nominated office is indicated by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not constitute or imply an endorsement of the candidate by the party indicated, and no candidate nominated by the qualified voters for any voter-nominated office shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. Nonpartisan Offices. A candidate for a nonpartisan office may not designate a party preference on the ballot.

Sample Ballot

TOP TWO CANDIDATES OPEN PRIMARY ACT

Many candidate contests on the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election ballot are governed by the open primary law that took effect in 2012. The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Previously known as partisan offices, voter-nominated offices are state legislative offices, U.S. congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In the open primary system, this means you can vote for any candidate, regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. Only the two candidates receiving the most votes – regardless of party preference – move on to the General Election regardless of vote totals. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (50 percent + 1), a General Election still must be held. Even if there are only two candidates in the open primary, a General Election is still required.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices can still run in the Primary Election. However, a write-in candidate can only move on to the General Election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the Primary Election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a General Election.

California's new open primary system does not apply to candidates running for local offices in the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election.

California law requires that the following information be printed in this pamphlet.

PARTY-NOMINATED/PARTISAN OFFICES

Political parties may formally nominate candidates for party-nominated/partisan offices at the Presidential Primary Election (not at the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election). A nominated candidate will represent that party as its official candidate for the specific office at the General Election and the ballot will reflect an official designation. The top vote-getter for each party at the Presidential Primary Election moves on to the General Election. Parties also elect officers of county central committees at the Presidential Primary Election.

A voter can only vote in the Presidential Primary Election of the political party he or she has disclosed a preference for upon registering to vote. However, a political party may allow a person who has declined to disclose a party preference to vote in that party's Presidential Primary Election.

VOTER-NOMINATED OFFICES

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at any Primary Election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at any Primary Election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the General Election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. The parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement in the county sample ballot pamphlet.

Any voters may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at any Primary Election move on to the General Election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the General Election, unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at any Primary Election.

NONPARTISAN OFFICES

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at any Primary Election, and a candidate at any Primary Election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the General Election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may NOT designate his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. Any candidate for a nonpartisan office who at a Primary Election receives a majority of the votes cast for candidates for that office shall be elected to that office and does not move on to the General Election. If no candidate receives a majority of votes cast, then the top two vote-getters at any Primary Election move on to the General Election. **EXCEPTIONS:** (1) The highest vote-getter at any Primary Election for Member, Orange County Board of Education, shall be elected to that office and does not move on to the General Election; and (2) The top two vote-getters at the Gubernatorial Primary Election for the office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction, a nonpartisan office, move on to the General Election.

HOW TO USE THIS SAMPLE BALLOT PAMPHLET

This Sample Ballot Pamphlet has information for ALL voters for the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election. You may use this Sample Ballot to mark your choices, and take it with you when you vote at the polls.

All of the Primary Election information is contained in this pamphlet, no matter what your political party preference is. By learning just a few tips about how to navigate through this pamphlet, you'll be ready to go.

What's inside...

Use this Pamphlet to learn how to:

- Vote-by-mail;
- Vote a paper **or** electronic ballot at the polls;
- Know what a Top-Two Primary means for you; and
- Work at the polls.

Also included:

- A sample ballot for each party, including for No Party Preference voters, who did not choose a party;
- Candidates' Statements, if any; and
- Local measures, if any.

Where are the Candidates' Statements and local measures?

Candidates' Statements are located after the nonpartisan ballot page. Not all pamphlets will contain Candidates' Statements.

If your voting area has local measures, they will follow the Candidates' Statements. Local measure documents may include the text, the arguments, tax rate statement, fiscal impact statement, bond project list, and impartial analysis.

How to learn about State propositions

To learn about the State propositions:

- See the Voter Information Guide provided by the California Secretary of State; or
- Go to the California Secretary of State's website:
sos.ca.gov

You will find a summary, text, arguments and analysis of each State proposition.

Where is the Sample Ballot for my party?

Look for your party on the back cover of this Sample Ballot Pamphlet. It is printed next to your name and address.

The sample ballots are printed in this order:

- Democratic
- Republican
- American Independent
- Americans Elect
- Green
- Libertarian
- Peace and Freedom

If you are affiliated with a qualified political party, you will be issued that official ballot.

What if I did not register with any party?

Voters who did not register with any qualified party are called No Party Preference voters, or NPP for short. Please see NPP voters in the No Party Preference section of this pamphlet.

Your vote counts!

VOTER INFORMATION

Can I vote if I moved to another address in Orange County?

Yes. But you must register at your new address for future elections. You may vote and re-register at the:

- Registrar of Voters' office; or
- The polling place for your new address

To find out if you're registered, visit: ocvote.com/verify.

Can I vote if I have not voted in the last 4 years?

Residence Confirmation: If you have not voted in any election within the preceding four years, and your residence address, name, or party preference was not updated during that time, you need to confirm your residency address in order to remain on the active voter list and receive election materials in the mail. Visit ocvote.com/confirm to confirm your residency.

How do I turn in my vote-by-mail ballot?

Return your voted ballot in the envelope provided:

- By mail;
- At any Orange County polling place on Election Day; or
- At the Registrar of Voters' office.

If you are unable to return your ballot, use your vote-by-mail envelope to authorize one of these people to return it for you.

- Spouse;
- Child or parent;
- Grandparent or grandchild;
- Brother or sister; or
- Someone who lives with you.

State law requires that a poll worker **must** make sure your envelope is filled out correctly.

Deadline to ask for a vote-by-mail ballot:

If you are already a permanent vote-by-mail voter, you will get your ballot in the mail soon.

If not, you may apply from **May 5, 2014 through May 27, 2014** for one-time vote-by-mail status: To apply:

- Fill out the application on the back cover of this pamphlet;
- Pick up an application at the Registrar of Voters' office; or
- Visit ocvote.com/votebymail.

We **must** receive your application by **May 27, 2014**, if you want to vote in the June 3, 2014 Statewide Direct Primary Election. You may mail it, drop it off at our office, or fax it to: (714) 560-4572. **Be sure to sign your application.**

To vote-by-mail for every election:

Check the Permanent Vote-by-Mail Voter box on your application. To confirm your status as a Permanent Vote-by-Mail voter, visit: ocvote.com/verify

Make it count! If your vote-by-mail ballot arrives after 8 p.m. on Election Day, your vote will **not** count. Mail early! Postmarks do not count!

Are all polling places accessible?

Look for the wheelchair access symbol on the back cover of your Sample Ballot. If it says:

- YES: Your polling place is accessible on Election Day;
- USABLE: Your polling place is temporarily accessible on Election Day; or
- NO: Your polling place is not accessible on Election Day.

If your polling place is not accessible, you may vote a paper or an electronic ballot curbside.

NO PARTY PREFERENCE

What used to be called “party affiliation” is now called “party preference” according to California law.

If you did not choose a political party when you registered to vote, you are a No Party Preference voter, or NPP for short.

Voters who choose a political party when they register will get a ballot for their party.

No Party Preference voters will get a nonpartisan ballot. Their ballot will have:

- Candidates for voter-nominated offices;
- Candidates for nonpartisan offices; and
- Ballot measures, if applicable.

VOTING AT YOUR POLLING PLACE

Electronic Ballot:

Candidate on the Ballot

Turn the select wheel until the blue bar highlights your choice. Press ENTER. If 2 or more candidates can be elected for an office, repeat this process for your next choice(s).

Write-In Candidate

Turn the select wheel until the blue bar highlights the blank space after the other candidates' names. Press ENTER to type the qualified write-in candidate's name.

Measure

Turn the select wheel until the blue bar highlights a square to the left of "Yes" or "No". Press ENTER on the square of your choice.

Note: When voting electronically, these abbreviations are used for political parties:

DEM – Democratic **REP** – Republican **AI** – American Independent
AE – Americans Elect **GRN** – Green **LIB** – Libertarian **PF** – Peace and Freedom

Paper Ballot:

Candidate on the Ballot

Use the black or blue pen provided to **completely** fill in the box to the left of the candidate's name. If 2 or more candidates can be elected for an office, repeat this process for your next choice(s). Do not mark more boxes than the number of candidates allowed.

Write-In Candidate

Write the qualified write-in candidate's name in the blank space after the other candidates' names. Then **completely** fill in the box to the left of the name you wrote. Do not write-in a name that is already printed on the ballot. If you do not write-in a name, do not fill in the box to the left of that line.

Measure

To vote on any measure, **completely** fill in the box to the left of the word "Yes" or "No".

If you make a mistake, ask a poll worker for a new ballot.

Put your voted ballot in the privacy folder. Then give it to a poll worker who will put it in the ballot box.

Protect your privacy. Do not sign or make extra marks on your ballot.

**FULL TEXT OF MEASURE A
COUNTY OF ORANGE**

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, ADDING ARTICLE V, SECTION 501 TO THE CHARTER OF ORANGE COUNTY TO PREVENT THE COUNTY OF ORANGE FROM PAYING REQUIRED EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND OTHER COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIALS WHO BEGIN A TERM ON OR AFTER JUNE 4, 2014.

The People of the County of Orange, California, hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Article V, Section 501 is added to the Charter of Orange County to read:

ARTICLE V. ELECTED OFFICIAL PENSION CONTRIBUTIONS

Sec. 501. Elected Official Pension Contributions

The County shall not pay the employee retirement contributions referenced under Government Code Section 31581.1 (as of October 1, 2013) and Government Code Section 31581.2 (as of October 1, 2013), for elected, appointed, or reelected Members of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officials who begin a term on or after June 4, 2014.

**IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS BY COUNTY COUNSEL
COUNTY OF ORANGE
MEASURE A**

This measure would add a new pension related provision for members of the Orange County Board of Supervisors and other County elected officials to the County Charter, adopted by the voters on March 5, 2002.

Employees, including elected officials, are required by California law to make contributions towards their pension benefits. The amounts of these contributions are set by California law. California law permits county governments to pay all or a portion of these pension contributions on behalf of employees. Currently, the County of Orange does not pay the employee contributions for members of the Board of Supervisors. The County of Orange does pay the employee contributions on behalf of some other County elected officials.

If approved by a majority of the voters in the County casting votes on this measure, the County would no longer be allowed to pay any portion of the employee retirement contributions for elected, reelected or appointed members of the Board of Supervisors and other County elected officials who begin a term of office on or after June 4, 2014. Such officials would be required to pay their full employee retirement contributions.

Future changes to the County Charter, including this provision on payment of employee retirement contributions for members of the Board of Supervisors and other County elected officials, must be submitted to the voters for approval.

This measure was placed on the ballot by the Board of Supervisors.

A copy of the proposed amendment to the County Charter is included in this voter information pamphlet. In addition, a copy of the proposed amendment is posted on the Registrar of Voters' website, <http://www.ocvote.com/>. Voters may also contact the Registrar of Voters' office and request that a copy of the proposed amendment be mailed to them at no cost.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE A

Orange County's unfunded pension liability is over \$5 billion. We must rein in out of control government employee pensions.

This ballot measure will prohibit taxpayer subsidies of politicians' employee pension contributions. In other words, this measure will require Orange County's politicians to pay their own employee pension contributions instead of using a taxpayer subsidy to pay their employee pension contributions.

The Orange County Charter is the county's version of a constitution. **By voting for this measure, we will enshrine pension reform as one of the core principles of our County government.**

This measure ensures the politicians can **never again** vote to give themselves a taxpayer funded subsidy of their own employee pension contributions; **only the voters will have the ability to ever change this.**

Passing this measure will send a message to self-serving politicians:

- No more taxpayer subsidies of employee pension contributions
- The voters have the ultimate power to decide what happens with taxpayer money
- Taxpayer dollars should go to public safety, roads, and parks, not to subsidize pensions for politicians

In the private sector, people have to fund their own 401(k) retirement accounts and there *might* be an employer match. Why should the taxpayers have to fund the politicians' entire pensions? **This ballot measure stops this perk.**

The *Orange County Register's* Editorial Board wrote in support of sending this ballot measure to Orange County voters because they support requiring elected officials to pay their own employee pension contributions. The Orange County Employees Association (OCEA) leadership supports this measure and its efforts to require elected officials to pay their own employee pension contributions. When the *Orange County Register's* Editorial Board and the OCEA leadership agree on something, you know it must be a good idea.

VOTER BILL OF RIGHTS

1. You have the right to cast a ballot if you are a valid registered voter.

A valid registered voter means a United States citizen who is a resident in this state, who is at least 18 years of age and not in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony, and who is registered to vote at his or her current residence address.

2. You have the right to cast a provisional ballot if your name is not listed on the voting rolls.
3. You have the right to cast a ballot if you are present and in line at the polling place prior to the close of the polls.
4. You have the right to cast a secret ballot free from intimidation.
5. You have the right to receive a new ballot if, prior to casting your ballot, you believe you made a mistake.

If at any time before you finally cast your ballot, you feel you have made a mistake, you have the right to exchange the spoiled ballot for a new ballot.

Vote-by-mail voters may also request and receive a new ballot if they return their spoiled ballot to an elections official prior to the closing of the polls on Election Day.

6. You have the right to receive assistance in casting your ballot, if you are unable to vote without assistance.

7. You have the right to return a completed vote-by-mail ballot to any precinct in the county.
8. You have the right to election materials in another language, if there are sufficient residents in your precinct to warrant production.
9. You have the right to ask questions about election procedures and observe the elections process.

You have the right to ask questions of the precinct board and election officials regarding election procedures and to receive an answer or be directed to the appropriate official for an answer. However, if persistent questioning disrupts the execution of their duties, the board or election officials may discontinue responding to questions.

10. You have the right to report any illegal or fraudulent activity to a local elections official or to the Secretary of State's Office.
