2024 Presidential General Election



2024 General Election – Important Dates

- Wednesday, September 25, 2024: Voter Information Guide Mailing Began
- Monday, October 7: Vote-by-Mail Ballot Mailing and Early Voting Begins
- Monday, October 21, 2024: Last Day to Register to Vote
- Saturday, October 26, 2024: Select Vote Centers Open
- Saturday, November 2, 2024: All Vote Centers Open
- Tuesday, November 5, 2024: Election Day/Last Day to Vote
- Tuesday, December 3, 2024: Certify Election Results



Assembly Bill 3184 (Berman)

- Amended in Senate to add urgency provisions specific only to the 2024 Presidential General Election regarding deadlines for Vote-By-Mail signature cures and completion of the canvass.
- Signature Cure Deadline – 5 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 1
- Certification Deadline – no earlier than Tuesday, Dec. 3
- Signed into law by Governor Newsom on Sept. 22.



Post-Election Canvass Activities

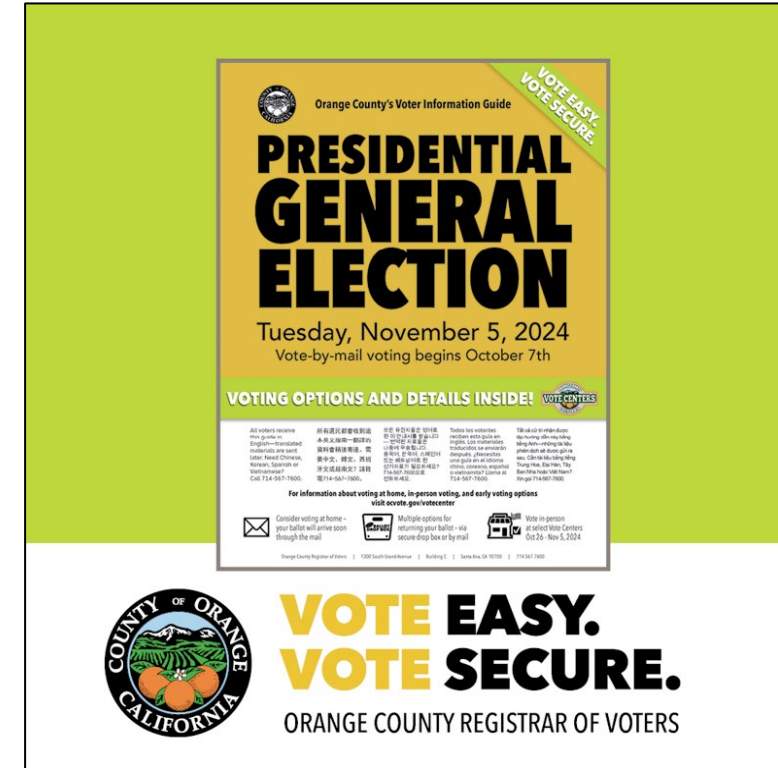
28-Day Canvass Period

- Process and count VBM Ballots
- VBM Ballots postmarked by Election Day received within seven days of Election
- Provisional Ballots (including Same Day Voter Registration ballots)
- Signature verification and signature cure process
 - Allowed to cure signature up to two days before the County certifies results.
- Post-election Audits and Tests

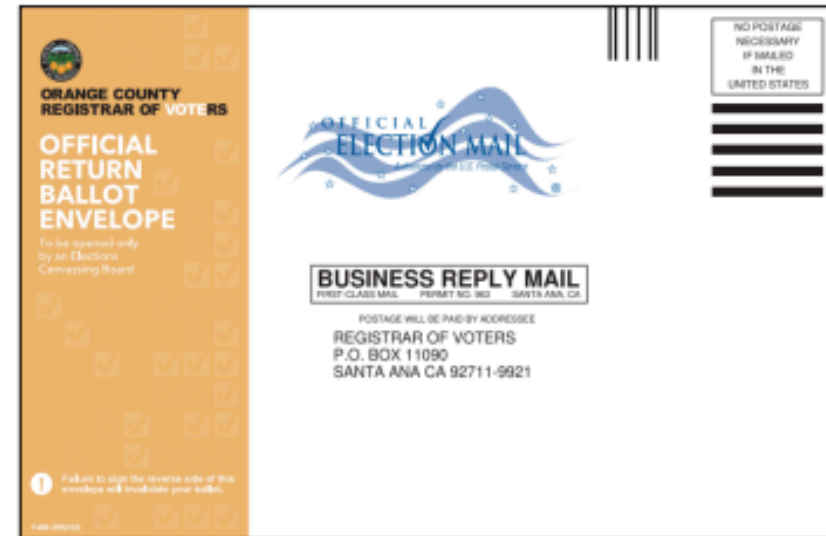

- Vote-by-Mail ballots – starting October 7
- Track your Vote-by-Mail ballot





2024 Presidential General Election

- All registered voters will receive a Vote-By-Mail ballot
- 184 Vote Centers
 - 38 open for 11 Days
 - 146 open for 4 Days
 - 23 with a drive thru ballot drop off
 - 5 pop-up voting events
- 123 Ballot Drop Boxes open on October 7
 - Open for 30 days until November 5

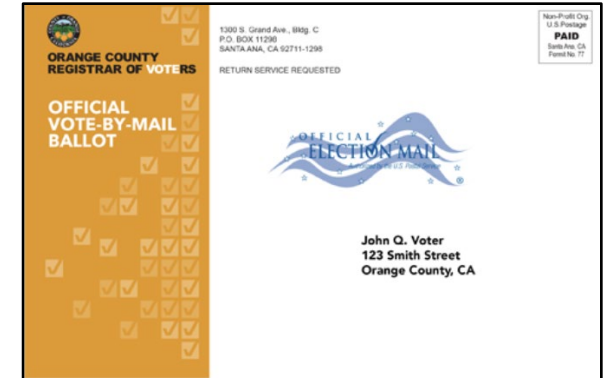

Four Ways to Vote

- US Postal Service – no postage necessary
- Ballot Drop Boxes
- Drop off in person at any Vote Center, including ROV
- Vote in-person at any Vote Center

- Voter nominated elections for U.S. Senator (partial & full term), Congressional Representatives, State Senate, and Assembly

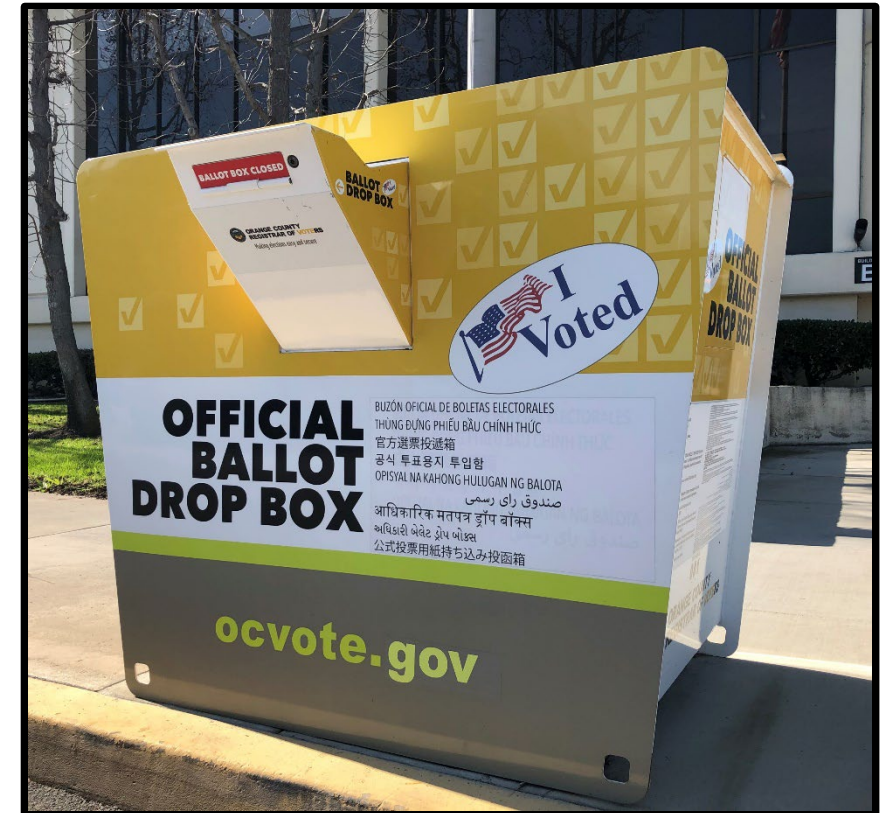


Security and Integrity Measures

- Physical
- Technical
- Process
- People

Security and Integrity Measures – Physical

- Badge access controls
- Auditable security seals on equipment
- Ballot drop boxes
 - Made of thick, secure metal
 - Bolted to concrete
 - Individually keyed





Security and Integrity Measures - Technical

- Electronic voter check-in with near real-time updates
- Voter data is secured and encrypted while in transit and at rest
- All votes are cast on paper ballots
- Pre- & post-election confirmation of voting system software version
- Vote tally system is not connected to the internet
- Intrusion detection/prevention systems in place



Security and Integrity Measures – Process

- Voter File Maintenance – Regular and consistent
- Ballot Handling – Daily randomized routes, GPS tracking, radio communication with controlled chain of custody
- Signature verification of all Vote-by-Mail ballots
- Pre-election & post-election Logic and Accuracy tests
- 1% Manual Tally and Risk Limiting Audit
- Partnerships – Federal, State, and Local law enforcement & DA



Voter Registration File Maintenance

- Perform all daily maintenance activities required by law
- Perform additional discretionary activities, including
 - Identification of duplicate voter registration files
 - Access third-party data to identify possible voter changes
 - Encourage voters to re-register to update their information and signature
- Performance Measurements:
 - 700,375 updates to voter registration records in 2023
 - 97,477 voters cancelled in 2023 (incl. 14,987 deceased)
 - Only 1.59% of the 2024 Primary Election ballots were undeliverable

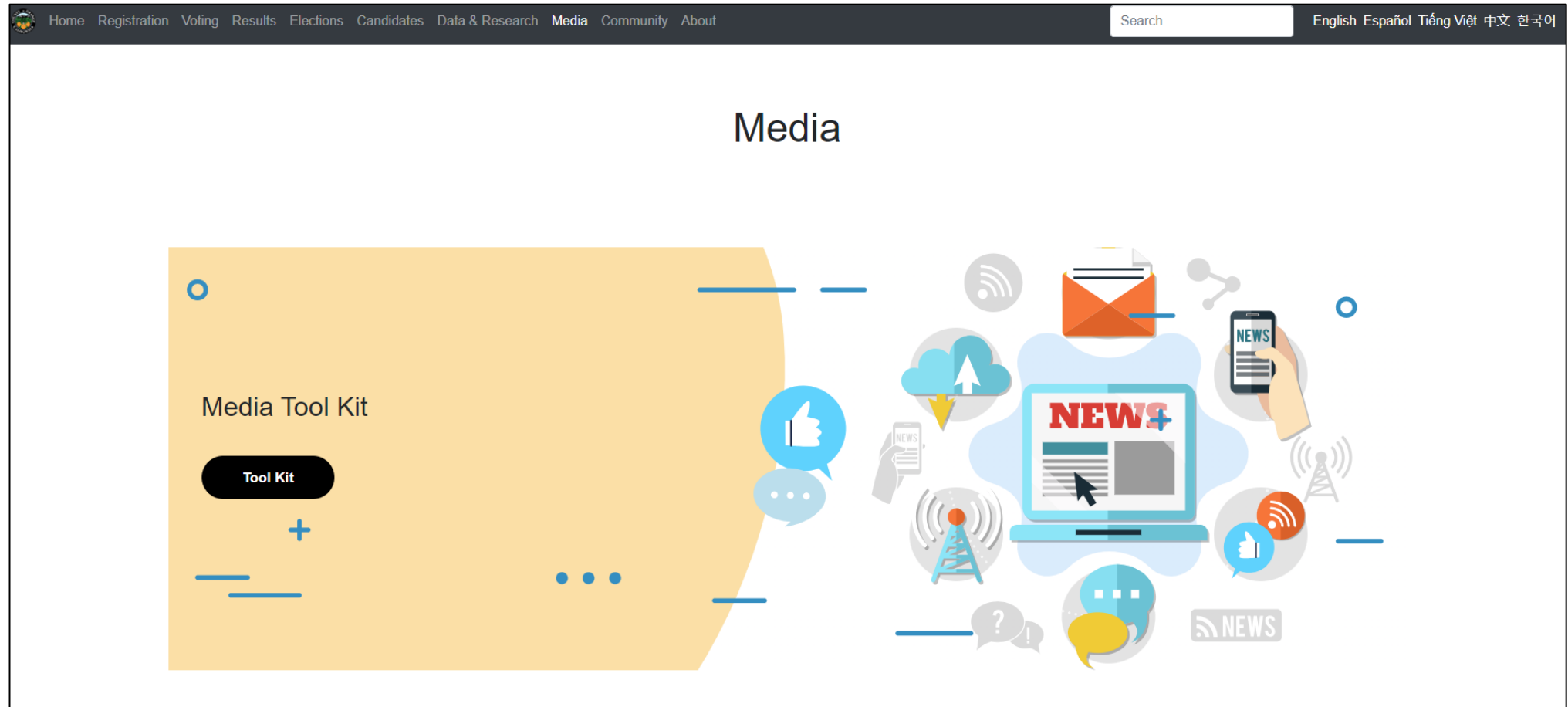


Security and Integrity – People

- Background checks on all employees
- Extensive training provided to all employees
- Two-person integrity for movement of ballots
- Use of DA Investigators, Sheriff's deputies, and security officers
- Command Center/Vote Center Help Desk
- Rapid deployment teams

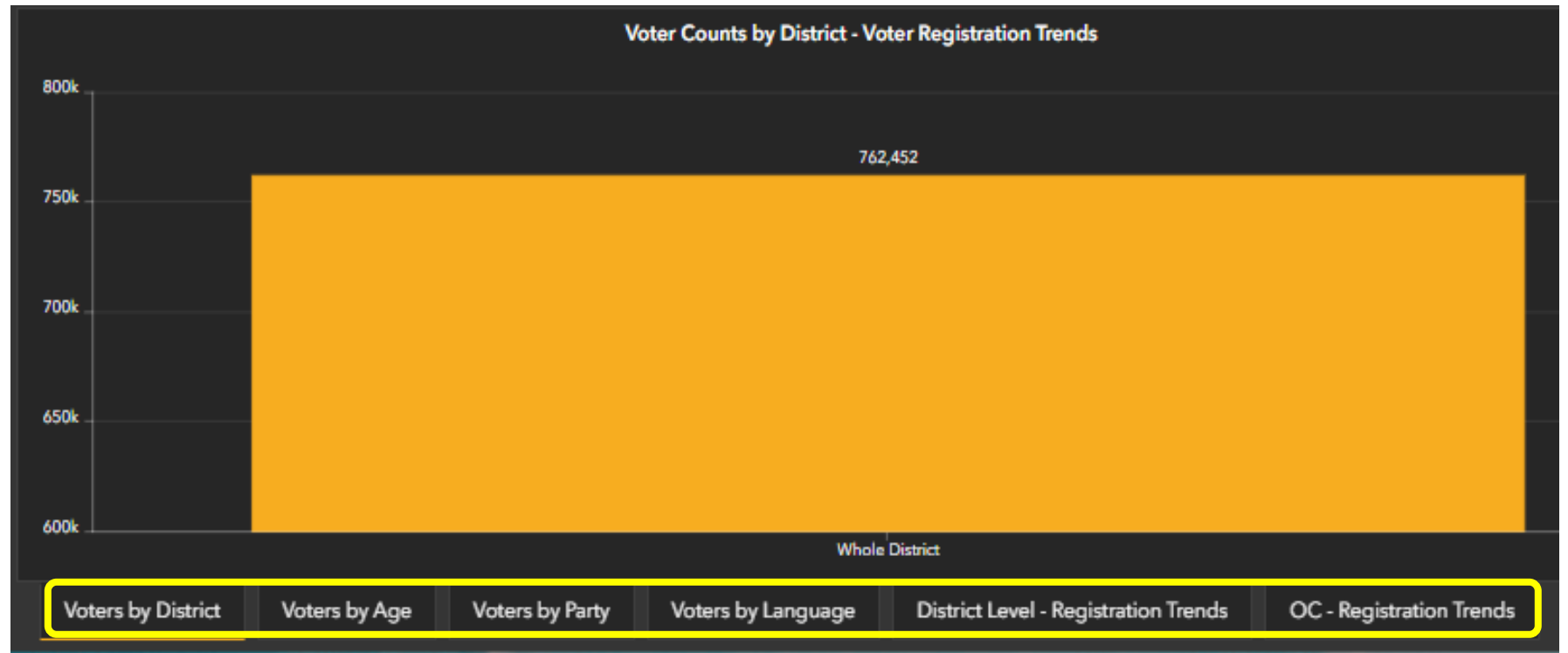

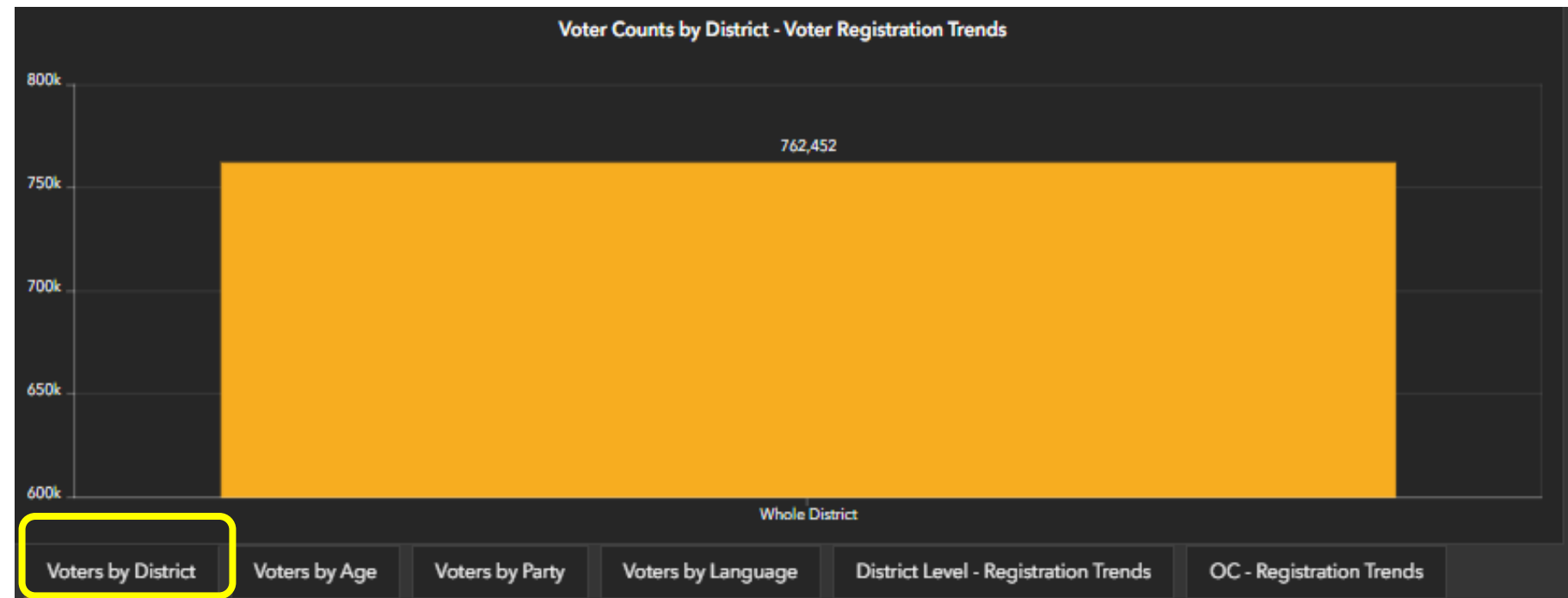


District Registration on Map Central

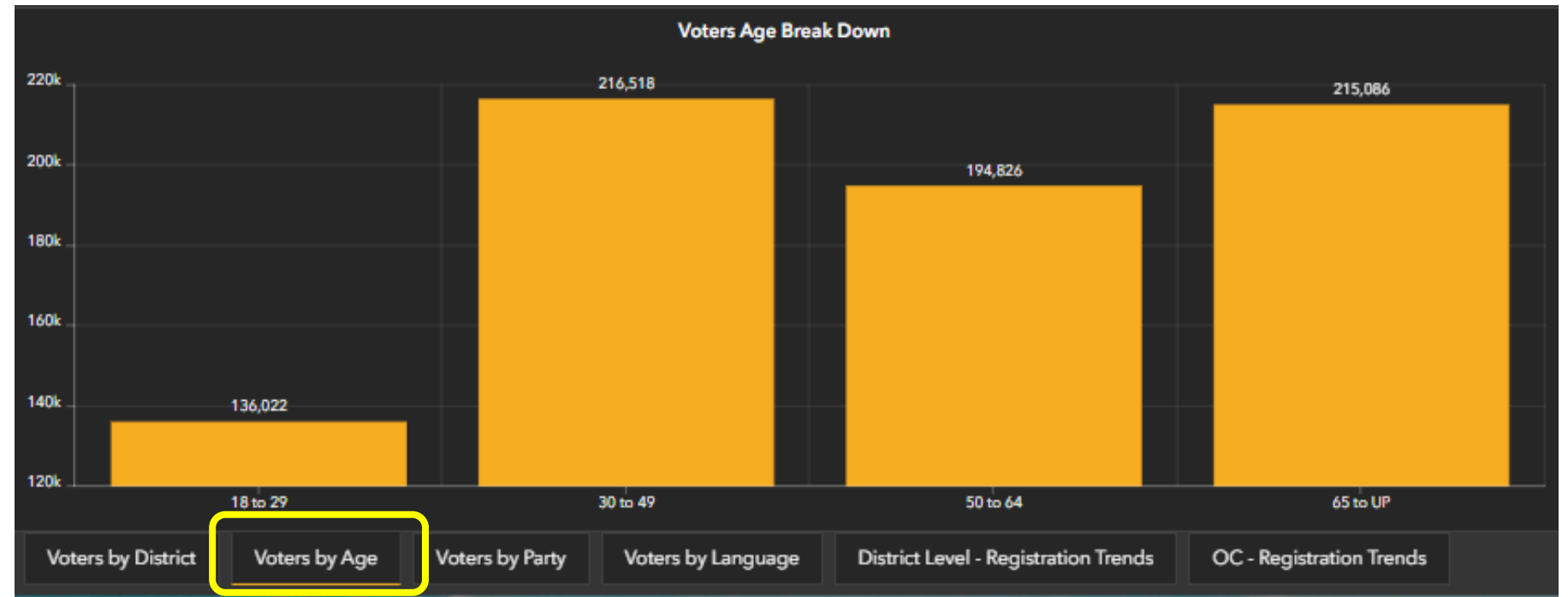


Age Group Registration on Map Central

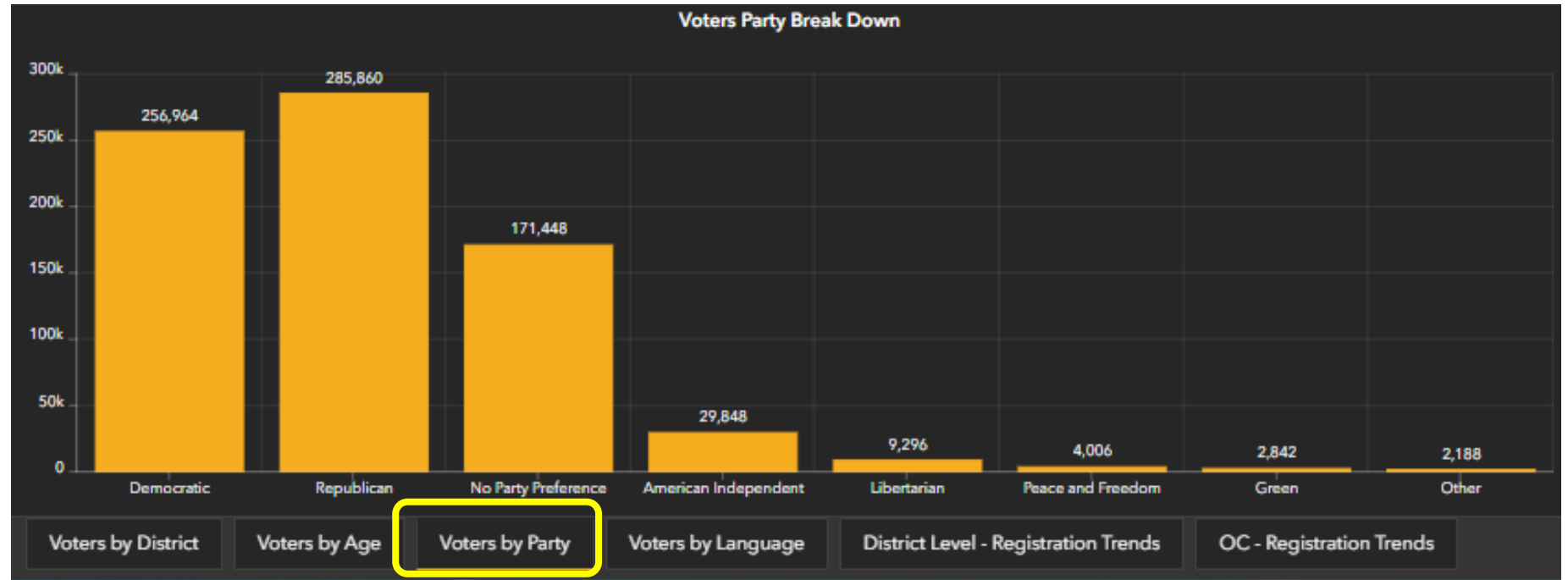

 - Visuals of ballots on pallets being loaded for transport to USPS for mailing on Monday, October 7, 2024
- Monday, October 7, 2024: Early Voting Begins
 - OC ROV office open for in-person voting
 - Ballot drop-off locations open
- Tuesday, October 8, 2024: Testing and VBM Ballot Processing Begins
 - Creation and scanning of test ballots for Logic and Accuracy Test
 - VBM ballot processing includes sorting, signature verification



Media Opportunities Schedule

- Saturday, October 26, 2024: 38 Select Vote Centers Open for 11 Days
 - Visuals of Vote Centers opening
 - Set up visuals available
- Tuesday, October 29, 2024: Media Tour at OC ROV
 - Guided tour of ballot-processing center
 - TV stand-ups with OC Registrar
- Saturday, November 2, 2024: 146 Additional Vote Centers Open for 4 Days
 - Visuals of Vote Centers opening and set up



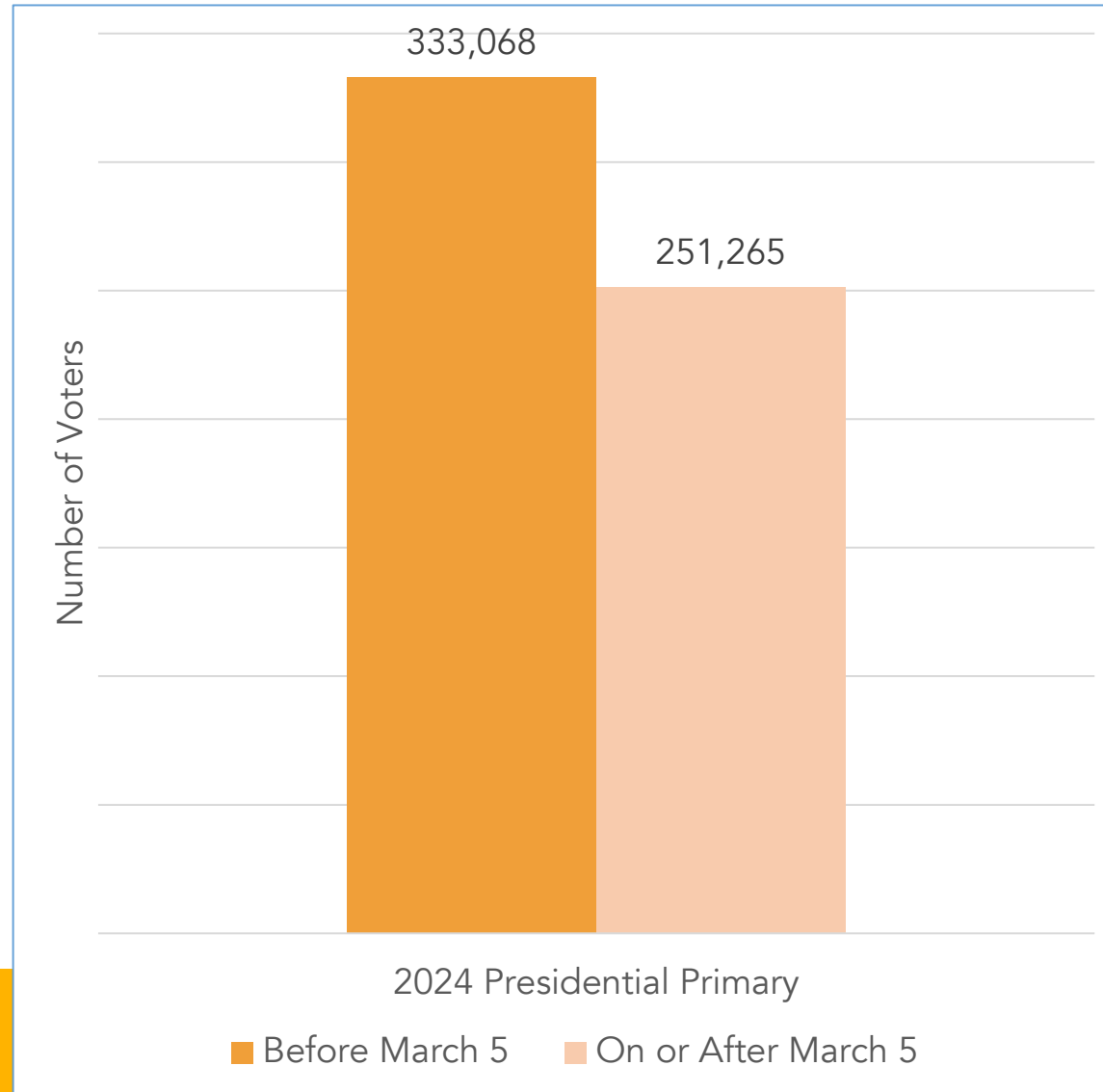
Media Opportunities Schedule

- Tuesday, November 5, 2024: Election Day
 - Ballot processing and counting at OC ROV
 - Results starting at 8:05 p.m., followed by 9:30 p.m., and then each half hour until all precincts have been reported on election night
- Wednesday, November 6, 2024: Official Canvass Begins
 - VBM ballot processing and counting continues
 - Audits and post-election testing of election equipment and software
 - Daily schedule available – ocvote.gov/observe

Expanded Ballot Processing Capacity

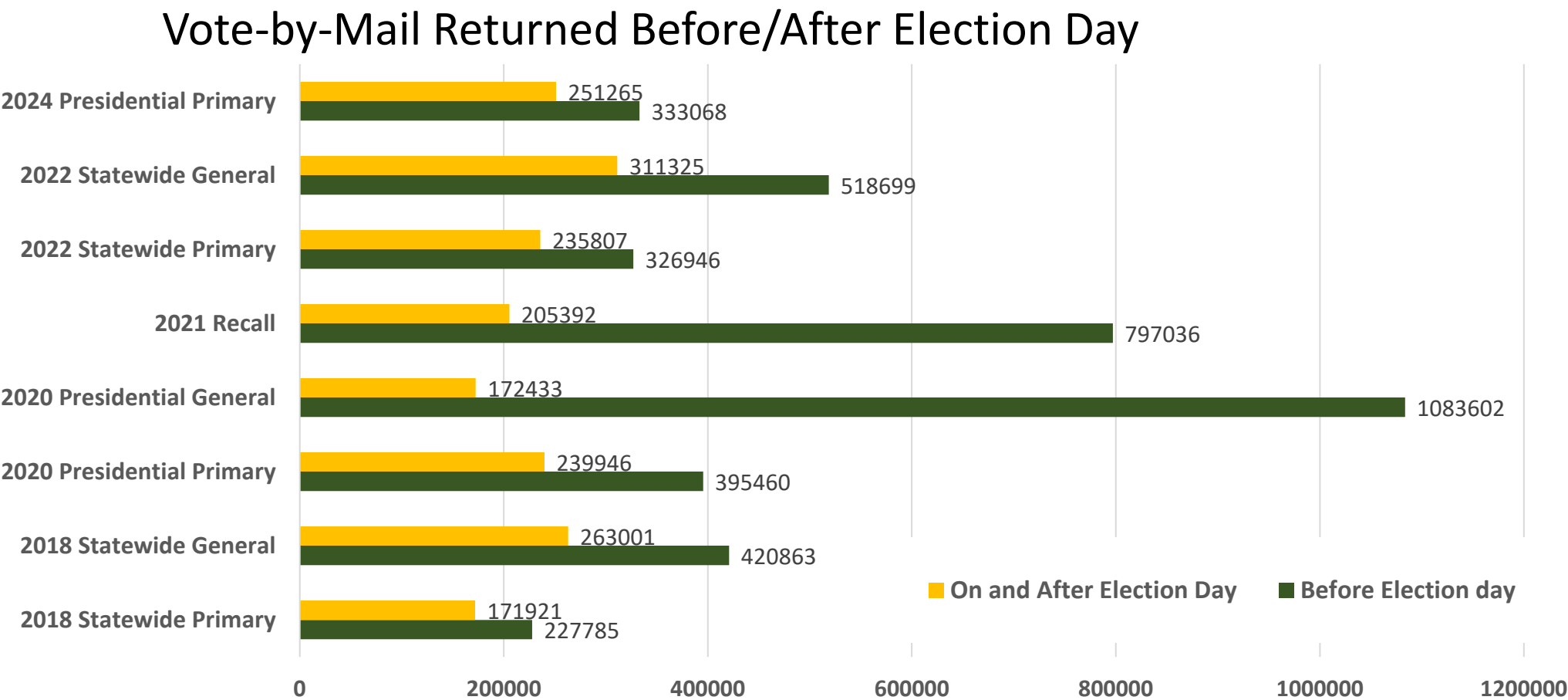


Vote-by-Mail Returned Before/After Election Day





Vote-by-Mail Returned Before/On Election Day



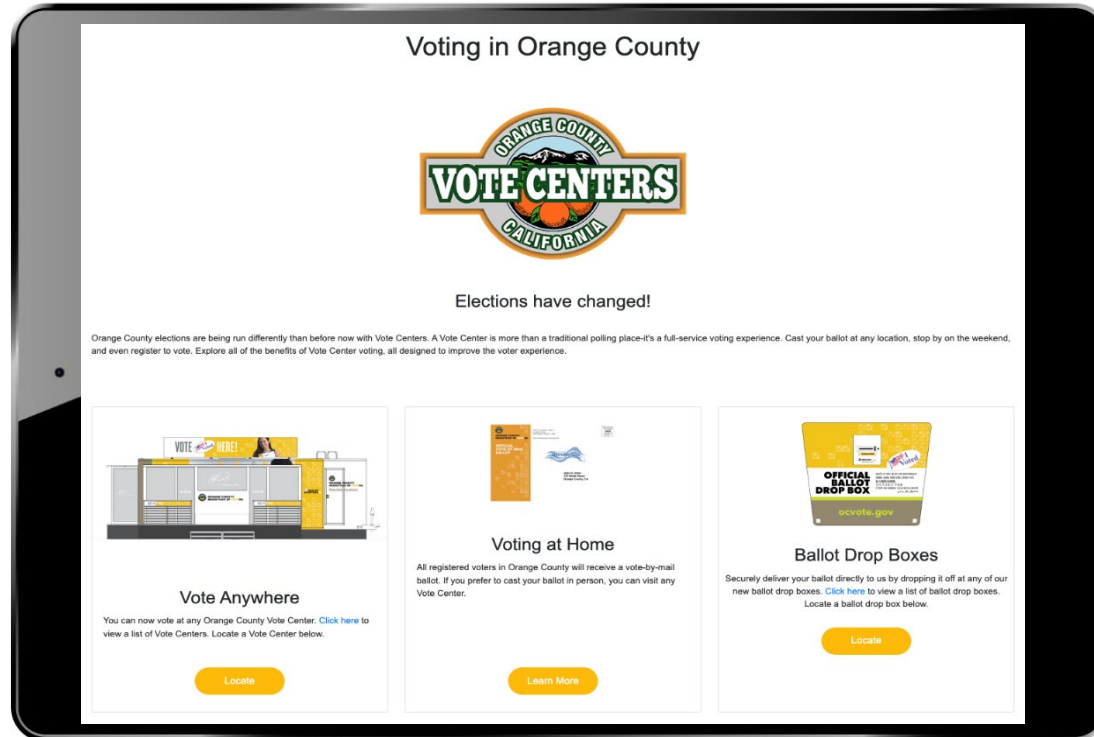


Building Operating Capacity

- County invested \$4.1 million on vote-by-mail ballot processing equipment
- Results in 2024 Presidential Primary Election
 - Early ballots in drop boxes started process same-day
 - 91% of early ballots in first results (up from 85% in Nov. 2022)
 - By E+7, counted 96% of all ballots (up from 89% in Nov. 2022)
