INTRODUCTION

The Orange County Registrar of Voters is committed to protecting each registered voter’s right to cast a ballot safely and securely. To help voters better understand how the State of California and Orange County are preparing for the November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election, this Communications Tool Kit provides a variety of tools to enable people and organizations to ensure local voters are well informed about how, when and where to cast a ballot. From social media posts, infographics, videos and more, this tool kit covers all the need-to-know information.

- Voting options – How to vote
- Voting locations – Where to vote
- Voting period – When to vote
- Safety – Creating a safe environment for election workers and voters
- Security – Protecting the election process and votes

IMPORTANT TOPICS

There are many important topics to address as we ramp up for the 2024 Presidential General Election. Here is a list of the messages we have identified as critical for the 2024 Presidential General Election. You’ll notice these themes throughout the materials provided in the tool kit below.

- Our voter education campaign tagline is “Vote Easy. Vote Secure.” It is reflected in all of our communication materials.
- You Have Voting Options – While Vote-by-Mail ballots are being delivered to all registered voters, there are four ways to vote.
- You Have More Days to Vote – Vote-by-Mail ballots can be cast starting 29 days before the traditional Election Day; Select Vote Centers are open for 11 days for in-person voting.
- Updating Your Voter Registration is Key – We’re encouraging people to register (if they haven’t) and voters to make sure the information they have on file is up to date and correct!
- We Need the Community’s Help – The Registrar of Voters team is currently scheduling voter education presentations to community organizations, and we’re encouraging people to contact us about presenting to their group!

- Thursday, September 26: Voter Information Guides begin to be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7: Vote-by-Mail Ballots begin to be delivered to U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7: Early Voting Begins – Registrar of Voters’ office and all Ballot Drop Boxes open
- Monday, October 21: Last day to register to vote
- Saturday, October 26: *SELECT* Vote Centers open across the county / Vote In-Person
- Saturday, November 2: All Vote Centers open / Vote In-Person
- Tuesday, November 5: Voting ends at 8 p.m.

SECURITY AND INTEGRITY MEASURES

- Physical:** Ballot Drop Boxes are made out of thick secure metal. Each drop box is bolted to the concrete and has its own individual key to open it.
- Technical:** Voter participation data is encrypted when shared in near real time between all Vote Centers and the Registrar of Voters to prevent double voting.
- Process:** All ballot scanners, vote tally equipment and software are tested before and after Election Day to ensure all votes are counted accurately.
- People:** The Registrar of Voters background checks every election worker prior to hiring. All workers complete extensive training on election equipment security measures.

YOUR VOTE IS SECURE

- Every voter marks a paper ballot.
- Chain of custody maintained for all voted ballots.
- Ballot audit confirms accuracy of results.
- Ballots securely stored after election.

ELECTION SECURITY FACTS

2024 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION

- Ballot Collection:** Two-person ballot collection teams submitted nearly **12,000** verification photos during the 2024 Presidential Primary Election. All photos are reviewed in real time to ensure no ballots are missed and that the ballots and drop boxes are secured.
- Tamper-Proof Voting Equipment Seals:** More than **25,000** voting equipment seals were checked and logged at Vote Centers during the 2024 Presidential Primary Election to prevent tampering.
- Signature Verification:** During the 2024 Presidential Primary Election, trained Registrar of Voters staff compared more than **600,000** signatures on return envelopes of cast Vote-by-Mail ballots to the voters' signatures in the voter registration file.

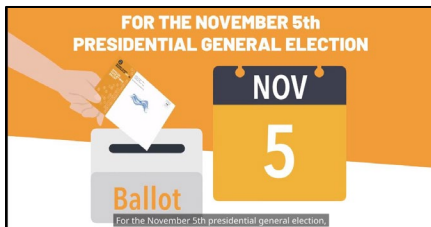

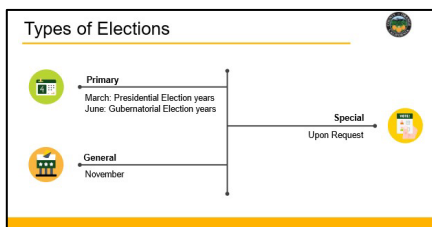

To ensure your mail-in ballot is counted, here are some helpful tips when filling it out:

1. Use black ink when filling out your ballot.
2. Check your ballot for any damage, tears, or unclear marks.
3. Remember to sign the envelope before you mail your ballot or drop it off.
4. Mail ballots must be postmarked by November 5, so submit your ballot on or before that date.

Article #1

How to Vote in Orange County in the 2024 Presidential General Election

Recommended timing for use: September 25-November 5

For the upcoming 2024 Presidential General Election, Vote-by-Mail ballots will be delivered to the U.S. Post Office on October 7. Early voting begins and Ballot Drop Boxes will be unlocked on this day as well.

Registered voters in Orange County have several voting options they can use to cast their ballot for the Presidential General Election. Voters can return their ballot by mail, or at one of the countywide Ballot Drop Boxes, or an Orange County Vote Center. Voters can also cast a ballot in person at a Vote Center. Learn more about your voting options at ocvote.gov/voting.

Thirty-eight Vote Centers open on October 26. An additional 146 Vote Centers will open on November 2 for the last four days of voting, including Election Day. At a Vote Center, you can vote, update your registration, register to vote, get a replacement ballot, or receive general assistance. Find a Vote Center near you and view live wait times at ocvote.gov/votecenter.

To find a Ballot Drop Box near you, click ocvote.gov/dropbox.

The deadline to register to vote for the 2024 Presidential General Election is October 21. Register to vote at ocvote.gov/registration.

Article #2

The Voter Registration Deadline is October 21

Recommended timing for use: September 25-October 21

The voter registration deadline for the 2024 Presidential General Election is October 21. You can register to vote in Orange County online today at ocvote.gov/register.

If you want to check your registration status, or if you need to make updates, you can do so online at ocvote.gov/verify.

If you are unable to meet the voter registration deadline, you can still conditionally register to vote through November 5. Conditional voter registration extends the existing 15-day registration deadline in California to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote provisionally 14 days prior to an election and on Election Day.

You can conditionally register in-person at a Vote Center or at the Registrar of Voters located at 1300 S. Grand Avenue, Bldg. C, Santa Ana, 92705. You may also conditionally register to vote online at ocvote.gov/registration but must then go to a Vote Center or the Registrar of Voters to be issued a provisional ballot.

Article #3

Vote Centers in Orange County Open on October 26

Recommended timing for use: October 7-November 5

Vote Centers are your one-stop shop for voting and registration needs for the 2024 Presidential General Election. There are more than 180 Vote Centers throughout Orange County where you can vote, update your registration, register to vote, get a replacement ballot or receive general assistance. Select Vote Centers open on October 26, and all Vote Centers will be open on November 2 through November 5. You can locate a Vote Center, view hours of operations, and see live wait times at ocvote.gov/time.

You still have the option to vote by mail or use a secure Ballot Drop Box to cast your ballot. Vote-by-Mail ballots can be returned to the U.S. Post Office starting October 7 and do not require postage. Your Vote-by-Mail ballot return envelope must be postmarked by November 5. You can locate a secure Ballot Drop Box near you at ocvote.gov/dropbox.

Important Dates for the 2024 Presidential General Election

Recommended timing for use: September 25-October 21

The Orange County Registrar of Voters created an Election Calendar to help you keep track of important deadlines for the 2024 Presidential General Election. You can access the calendar at ocvote.gov/calendar

- Thursday, September 26: Voter Information Guides begin to be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7: Mail Ballots begin to be delivered to U.S. Postal Service
Monday, October 7: Vote-by-Mail Ballots begin to be delivered to U.S. Postal Service
- Monday, October 7: Early Voting Begins – Registrar of Voters Office and all Ballot Drop Boxes open for ballot drop-offs
- Monday, October 21: Last Day to register to vote
- Saturday, October 26: *SELECT* Vote Centers open across the county / Vote in-person
- Saturday, November 2: All Vote Centers Open / Vote in-person
- Tuesday, November 5: Voting ends at 8 p.m.

Article #5

Election Security in Orange County

Recommended timing for use: September 25-November 5

Election security is a top priority for the Orange County Registrar of Voters. Security measures for the 2024 Presidential General Election include:

- Test the accuracy of all ballot scanners before and after the election.
- Hand count ballots from at least 1% of all precincts – randomly selected – to ensure the voting system tally is accurate.
- Confirm with the Secretary of State before and after the election that the certified voting system software has not been modified.

Additionally, all votes are cast on paper ballots, and the vote tally system is not connected to the internet. The Orange County Registrar of Voters has partnerships with the Department of Homeland Security, State and local law enforcement, and the District Attorney’s office.

Registered voters have four safe and secure options to return their ballots in Orange County. You can vote by mail or return your ballot to a Ballot Drop Box or a Vote Center. You can vote in-person at any of the Vote Centers, too. All four ways ensure that your ballot will be received by the Registrar of Voters.

You can track your ballot through all steps of the process with OC Ballot Express. You also have the option to sign up for text and email updates. ocvote.gov/track

Article #6

Resources for Voters with Disabilities and Overseas Voters

Recommended timing for use: September 16-November 5

The Orange County Registrar of Voters has resources available for voters with disabilities and overseas voters. For the 2024 Presidential General Election, the Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail ballot provides voters the option to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot to be delivered to them electronically. The electronic ballot can be downloaded to the voter's computer, marked using the voter's own assistive technology, and then printed and returned as a paper ballot. ocvote.gov/ravbm

Additionally, all Vote Centers in Orange County will feature:

- Accessible ballot marking devices
- American Sign Language interpreter via video conferencing
- Curbside voting with a paper ballot
- Magnifiers and Signature Guides
- Assistance from trained Vote Center staff upon request
- Voters may bring up to two individuals of their choosing to assist in casting their ballot
