Another thing I am extremely proud of occurred when the county declared bankruptcy and tried to close two of our libraries. We knew if we allowed this they would never be reopened. We fought hard and kept all our libraries open.

During my tenure as Mayor we saw many important changes to our city including eight new hotels on Harbor Boulevard which are currently generating over \$13 million of much needed revenue for our city. This project literally changed the face of the boulevard eliminating drugs and prostitution which had become rampant.

As your Mayor, I improved city services, improved the overall appearance of our community and created a stable financial future for Garden Grove.

I am no stranger to hard work. For twenty years I ran a small business and had to meet a payroll for nine employees. I earned my Bachelor's degree while working full time. I served my country for three years in the United States Army.
