Since elected in 2004, the Midway City Sanitary District (MCSD) has achieved some remarkable advances. The cities and sewer infrastructure served by MCSD are nearly 50 years old. In order to maintain the viability of our sewer infrastructure, avoid pump failure and sewer backups, I initiated the direction for a 20 year financial projection for replacement of capital equipment based on useful life, rehabilitation of sewer lines, rehabilitation or replacement of the pump stations, implementation of State mandated programs and all working facets of the district. There are four sewer pump stations in the MCSD, all which have exceeded their expected useful life by about double the number of years normally expected. With ever increasing construction, materials and maintenance costs the cost of rehabilitating and/or replacing these stations and miles of sewer lines exceeded the revenue the district could responsibly assume to bring in. Working with other agencies the MCSD has secured grants reimbursing approximately \$786,000 of these costs with grant applications pending for approximately \$929,750. MCSD has also cut costs by approximately \$1,414,000. That's a good report card for two years. I'm asking for your vote so I can keep working for you. Questions? Call me at 903-6072.

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
